Since many scientific researches about the Monarch butterfly are very confusing and contradicting, we decided to ask meta.ai some of the most popular questions that scientists may not have a clear answer yet for the hundreds of thousands citizen science participants in the Monarch conservation from all over North America.

By Google search we usually get thousands of pages to go through that most of us will never find the right answers, instead meta.ai searches the search engines and comes up with an accurate answer based on your key words and algorithms.

These questions we asked AI are all about the Monarch butterfly conservation topics and methods that most of us would like a second opinion on what most scientific claims and researches want us to believe.
